## Overview

Sicily is perhaps the place that most photographers dream of without knowing it. It's a place where a mutual fascination exists between those who are photographing and those being photographed. It is a place where you feel like a pioneer, an explorer, like a witness to a time and society that not many people have witnessed. Much of Sicily remains wonderfully untouched by the hand of global commerce and brands, and there is a real sense of going back in time. Our Workshop is a window into Sicily's everyday life and religious culture, and is fascinating, moving and unlike anything else you will witness.

This Workshop is intended for those who are comfortable in the operation of their cameras, and who relish the opportunity to work in crowds and work creatively under pressure. The workshop will be led by Jonathan Maher who has an intimate knowledge of the places and festivities we will photograph. Perhaps Sicily is the Italy that many people imagine Italy to be - we can assure you that this is a moving, emotional and incredibly rewarding photographic experience

The procession lasts 24 hours and during the day we follow it around, shooting at some of the best vantage points. Staying at a hotel in the centre of town means that those who wish to take a few hours sleep, can do so, in time for the emotional return of the procession in the morning

The morning will be taken to complete the shoot of the Good Friday procession that continues until today. The combination of the morning light against the exhausted procession followers is a photographer's dream

## Travel

We will make one pickup from the airport on your arrival, and one drop-off at the end of the course. If you cannot make your arrival time coincide with the pickup time, we would be happy to suggest alternative ways of getting to Trapani. Please note, that journeys made outside of our designated pickup and drop-off would be expenses covered by the participant.

There will be a private minibus leaving the airport between 4:00pm and 5:30pm

A minibus will shuttle participants from the Crystal Hotel in Trapani back to the airport, leaving at 9:30am, getting to the airport approximately one hour later.

## The Photography

### Photography

If photographing people, events, life and society is what you like to shoot, then this Masterclass is for you. Sicily presents a fascinating environment in which to not only take great pictures, but also witness and learn something very tangible about a country and its relationship with religion. The Masterclass spans over the Easter week, and is focussed primarily on two of the main Easter processions in the towns of Marsala and Trapani in the West of Sicily. The Easter processions are also a very personal moment for Sicilians - it is by no means a tourist attraction. As such we are privileged to witness communities, towns, old and young, all come together in an emotional outpour that spans the week.

The photography is 'street-shooting'. You'll be walking the streets, often working individually to make moving amongst the crowds easier. You'll be working light - one camera, probably one lens too. You'll be right amongst the people - part of the ceremony, and the challenge will be to better understand the delicate line between observer and participant.

The emotion of the celebrations over the week could not fail to move even the most steadfast atheist. It is quite an incredible sight to see such intense emotion displayed publicly. The images that will unfold in front of you are there for the taking - our goal is to guide you along the process, ensuring that your visual, creative and technical skills come together to create moving photography and a great learning experience.



## Teaching

Teaching is done through a combination of daily image review sessions, in the field demonstrations, and hands-on practice. As much of the shooting is to be done amongst towns and crowds, we set meeting points, where your instructor will be so that during the day's shooting, you can always find somebody to assist you and answer any questions. Other days will see us shooting at more leisurely locations such as the hill-top town of Erice or the ruins of Segesta. We normally get together at lunch time - a good time to do a 'business lunch' and discuss how the day is going.

In the evening we all head out for dinner together and have a good chat about the day's events. Image review sessions are conducted using a laptop and digital projector and take place in the hotel's conference room. For those wishing to use film, there are labs nearby that can process slide and film.

## Is this for me?

This course in Sicily is what we call a Masterclass. This means that it is designed for people who are relatively comfortable with the operation of their cameras.

In order for you to get the most out of this Masterclass, we suggest that all participants have the following:

Use an SLR camera with interchangeable lenses  
Comfortable with operating a camera's exposure manually

Our passion is photography, and we welcome all of you that share this love. One of the great benefits of learning in a group, is the knowledge you also gain from those around you. New ideas, shared critiques and a good sense of camaraderie are ingredients we actively try to encourage in all of our trips.
